pacyent / as I haue shewyd before in che . ii . chapytre of the fyfthe boke / but moch better it were and moze pvytable to folowe the lerned medycynes or physycyos whā they may be gottē O good lord how oftē have I sen an onlerned physycion mynyster his medicines that knewe noz dysseases nor yet the complexyō but ministred hete to hete / throughe the which the natall moistoue was spente / and the body dryed away & consumed or moystout to moystout / throughe the which the body rotted awaye / or colde / by the which the naturall hete that shalde preserue the life of man is hole mynyssed and brought to nought / for the holy prophet Job sayth that the lyfe of man is plāted for to dye a natall deth with out any payne / yf he may attayne his natall lyfe un to the deth / the whiche may so well come to purpose / by an expert & lerned maister or physycyon . 
